Camp Job Descriptions ~ Applications due May 3, 2009

The goal of every staff member at Camp McCullough is to "Reflect the Love of Christ" to campers, customers and other staff members with a willing, servants heart.

Please read over the following list of job descriptions. Ask the Lord to show you where you can serve this summer.

Kitchen Staff: Must have current health card. (A training day will be available for anyone who needs a card. If you are unable to make the training time at camp you will be required to get a card at the Pierce County Health Department.) Kitchen staff will set tables, wash the dishes and do some prep work for meals. You work for 1/2 hour before meals and about an hour after each meal. You may rotate duties with craft workers or help with recreation. You sleep in a tent or the tabin and use the block house facilities. You attend staff meetings, have a daily quiet time and sit in with campers for the group meetings.

Maintenance worker: You sweep and mop the lodge, empty kitchen garbage before and after meals, empty all lodge garbage, check all restrooms for paper goods and sanitation, take care of the recycle materials, change light bulbs, catch mice and kill spiders. You sleep in a tent or the tabin and use the blockhouse facilities. You attend staff meetings, have a daily quiet time and sit in with campers for the group meetings.

Lifeguard: Must have current First Aid/CPR for Professional Rescuer and Lifeguard certification. Must at least 16. You will answer to the Waterfront Director. In addition to Lifeguarding, you will clean the boats, sweep the beach and other waterfront chores. You will spend several hours a week practicing lifesaving skills and participate in fitness training. You must also be willing to help with camp activities such as First Aid during recreation and lodge set-up. You will sleep in a tent, use the blockhouse facilities, have a daily quiet time, attend staff meetings and sit with campers for group meetings.

Counselors and CIT's: It is your responsibility to "Reflect the love of Christ" to your campers as you guide your campers through the day. This includes, quiet times, meals, showers, activities like swimming and boating, evening devotions, group meetings, recreation, cabin cleaning and bedtime. You will sleep in the cabin with the campers and be on call 24/7. You will attend daily staff meetings and be ready to share the gospel and your personal testimony with your campers.

Music Leaders: You will work with a group of musicians and learn some new and age appropriate music for Beginners and Juniors. We need some instruments and some voices. Music leaders need to be able to in front of a group and lead songs with great enthusiasm. You may be called upon to help with skits, crafts, recreation, lodge set-up or kitchen help. You sleep in the tent or tabin and use the blockhouse facilities. You will attend daily staff meetings, have a daily quiet time and sit with the campers for the group meetings.

Craft helpers: You will work with a craft leader helping campers on their projects. You will spend some time learning how to do the craft and help with set-up and clean-up of the craft area. You may be called upon ahead of time to help prepare crafts. You may be so busy helping campers with their crafts that you will not be able to make one yourself. It is important that your conversation during craft time is appropriate for the campers. This is the time to ask the campers to tell you what they are learning during the meetings or share your testimony with them. You may rotate duties with kitchen staff and help with recreation. You will sleep in a tent or the tabin, use the blockhouse facilities, have a daily quiet time, attend staff meetings and sit with campers for group meetings.

Clean-up Crew: This crew will clean the lodge and cabins and have everything clean, sanitized and ready for the next group. Most of the time, this will be done on a Saturday afternoon. You don't have to be at camp for the whole week. If you have been at camp for the week before you can still be part of the clean-up crew. For camp to survive, we need outside groups to rent camp during the weeks that FPC is not using the facility. If we don't have a clean facility, groups will not come back. The clean-up crew is a vital part of camp ministry.

Photographer: You will need to be able to take digital pictures and video of every camper and staff member. You will take the group and cabin photos as well as photos of all the classes and activities. You will need to be able to burn the photos onto a DVD that will be given or sold to every camper. You will also need to produce hard copies of every photo so we can put them in an album. Camp will pay for cost of materials and printing. You will need to be at camp most of the week so you can be taking pictures of all activities.

Grounds Keeping: You must be at least 16 years of age. You will help with any maintenance or building projects, clear brush, pressure wash docks and ball courts, lawn upkeep, trail and road maintenance, firewood stacking, raking and weeding. You must be willing to work outdoors in all weather and be physically able to do heavy lifting, use shovels, and other hand tools. You will be under the direction of an adult and need to be able to work on your own. You will sleep in the tent or tabin, use the blockhouse facilities and have a daily quiet time.
